Introduction


The recent rain storms and flash floods have rendered thousands of families homeless in both urban and rural areas of Sindh and Balochistan. We are focusing on providing critical food and supplies to remote and marooned communities in 10 Union Councils of District Lasbela in Balochistan and District Dadu, Thatta and Badin in Sindh.

Pakistan Flood Situation


A confluence of erratic weather patterns manifested in low depressions, exceptional monsoon activity, and cloudbursts have triggered devastating floods across Pakistan. Approximately 33 million people have been affected with losses to lives, shelter, assets, and livestock. One-third of the country is inundated and the provinces of Sindh and Balochistan are the worst affected. The devastation and damage caused by the floods is valued at more than USD 10 billion and will leave a lasting impact on Pakistan's environment, economy and society. One of the biggest challenges in flood areas right now is Water, Food, and Hygiene.

Hisaar Foundation Response to Flood

Hisaar Foundation's intervention in flood-affected areas is spread over a two-year period and divided into three phases:

- **Phase 1** – Relief
- **Phase 2** – Recovery
- **Phase 3** – Rehabilitation

The **Relief** phase focuses on the provision of an immediate supply of safe drinking water to displaced people including essential food rations, temporary shelters, and medical and hygiene supplies. We commenced our relief distribution activities in August and concluded in December 2022.

The **Recovery** phase focuses on the provision of water purification devices and systems to people living in camps and temporary shelters. There will be a 6-month recovery period starting from January 2023 up to June 2023.

The **Rehabilitation** phase focuses on the return of displaced people and their resettlement. This phase focuses on rebuilding the homes and lives of the flood-affected communities. The Rehabilitation phase will extend over 18 months from July 2023 to December 2024, with a return to normalcy by the end of the intervention period.

Hisaar Foundation has completed its relief activities in four districts of Lasbela, Badin, Thatta and Dadu. With the overwhelming support of our donors, we were able to exceed our target of 1000 by double! By the end of our relief phase, we served 2034 families and delivered emergency and essential food ration, hygiene and basic shelters and medicine supplies to approximately 15,000 people. It gives us great pleasure to report that we were able to raise over Rs. 23.3 million in cash and kind donations as well as transport and services – significantly surpassing our fundraising target of Rs. 15 million. We were able to provide flood relief packs and carry out relief distribution activities to provide emergency support to 250 families in Lasbela and 500 in Dadu, 250 families in Badin, and 150 in Thatta, 100 in Tharparkar, and 64 families in Khairpur. We have installed 15 Water Ultrafiltration Systems in Sindh of which 1 system was installed in district Mirpurkhas and 1 installed in district Nawabshah, 2 in District Jamshoro and 11 Water systems in different locations in district Dadu.

- Provided food, hygiene and relief packs to 2034 families

Distribution at Lasbela – Baluchistan

First Distribution:

On 19th August 2022, flood relief packs were distributed to 100 families in Village Uraki, Tehsil Uthal, District Lasbela.



Second Distribution:

On 30th September 2022, flood relief packs were distributed to 150 families in Village Bambol Sharif , Tehsil Lakhra , District Lasbela.



Third Distribution

On 2nd November 2022, flood relief packs were distributed to 35 families in Village Muhammed Hussain Goth Tehsil Uthal, District Lasbela.



Fourth Distribution

On 1st November 2022, flood relief packs were distributed to 150 families in Village Mouza Rajal, Goth Is Ha Khani, Tehsil Bela, District Lasbela, Balochistan



Distribution at Badin– Sindh

First Distribution:

On 3rd October 2022, flood relief Packs were distributed to 100 families in District Badin, Sindh. The following villages were provided support as follows:

- 19 families in Village Mehro Khan Lashari, Tehsil Tando Bago District Badin
- 15 families in Village Jarar Bheel Deh Jharkas Pangrio Tehsil Tando Bago, District Badin
- 34 families in Village Pir Bux Mugheri, Tehsil Badin, District Badin
- 22 families in Village Qasim, Tehsil & District Badin
- 10 families in Village Siddique Kumbar, Tehsil & District Badin



Second Distribution:

On 5th October 2022, flood relief Packs were distributed to 150 families in Village Haji Khan Jatoti Tehsil Talhar District Badin.



Distribution at Thatta – Sindh

First Distribution

On 5th October 2022, flood relief Packs were distributed to 64 families in Union council Bijora, District Thatta.



Second Distribution

On 6th October 2022, flood relief Packs were distributed to 86 families in District Thatta, Sindh. The following areas were provided support as follows:

- 38 families in Union Council Chilia, District Thatta
- 36 families in Union Council Chatto Chand, District Thatta
- 12 families in Faqeker ki Goth, District Thatta



Third Distribution

On 31st October flood relief packs were distributed to 35 families in the following villages in Tehsil and District Thatta:

- Village Aaghar
- village Makhdoom
- village Shah Gohar Ganaj

Distribution at Dadu– Sindh

First Distribution:

On 11th September 2022, flood relief packs were distributed to 220 families in Rajo Gandho, Taluka Johi, District Dadu



Second Distribution:

On 16th October 2022, flood relief packs were distributed to 150 families in Village Pyaro Rustamani and Ibrahim Chadio of Taluka Johi, District Dadu.

On 18th October flood relief packs were distributed to 130 families in Village Allah Bachayo Panhwar, UC Pir Mashaikh Taluka Johi, District Dadu.




Third Distribution

On 1st November 2022, flood relief packs were distributed to 35 families in Village Ibrahim Chandio, Tehsil Johi, District Dadu.



Fourth Distribution

On 24th November 2022, flood relief packs were distributed to 232 families in Village Fazul Lund Baloch, UC 2 Johi, Tehsil Johi, District Dadu.



Fifth Distribution

On 14th December 2022, flood relief packs were distributed to 233 families of villages Shahmeer Gadhi and Ghulam Hussain Gadhi, UC Peer Mashaikh, Taluka Johi, District Dadu.



Distribution at Khairpur – Sindh

On 15th October 2022, flood relief packs were distributed to 64 families in Village Jhango UC Ali Muhammad Machi Taluka Kot Diji, Village Qaim wassan and Village Haji Laik Bhanbhro in District Khairpur



In Kind Distribution

On 16th October 2022, in kind goods were distributed to 100 families in Village Mohammed Ali Chandio, UC Roshanabad, Taluqa Judo, District Mirpurkhas from Hisaar Foundation with the support of the Social Welfare Department-Tharparkar



Hisaar Foundation delivered medicines to HANDS for the medical camp at Kareem Clinic, Indus town district West Karachi on 29th September 2022.



At the end of December 2022, Hisaar Foundation has concluded its flood relief activities. We will be focusing on Recovery and Rehabilitation work to provide long-term support to 1000 families in Johi-Dadu over the next 24 months.

Installation of Hand-Operated Ultrafiltration Systems

In addition to flood relief packs, Hisaar Foundation has installed 15 hand-operated ultrafiltration systems to convert flood water and contaminated water into safe drinking water. The systems have been installed in the following locations as follows:
